Embracing the Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope in Our Diocese

As we prepare to embark on the Jubilee Year of 2025, proclaimed by Pope Francis with the theme "**Pilgrims of Hope**," I write to share with you its significance, opportunities for grace, and plans for our Diocese of Cork and Ross.

What is the Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is a special time of grace and spiritual renewal, rooted in the tradition of the Church and celebrated every 25 years. It is a time for pilgrimage, prayer, reconciliation, and hope. The Holy Father has called us to become "Pilgrims of Hope," journeying together in faith as witnesses of God's steadfast love in a world longing for healing and peace.

The Launch of the Jubilee Year: Sunday 5th January

We will formally launch the Jubilee Year in the Diocese of Cork and Ross, with Mass in **St. Mary and St. Anne's Cathedral at 11:30am** on Sunday 5th January. I invite all parishes to join in prayer and celebration on this day, marking the beginning of this sacred year. Integration with the Year of Prayer, Listening, and Discernment:

Integration with the year of Prayer, Listening, and Discernment:

In our diocese, the Jubilee Year will be deeply integrated into the ongoing **Year of Prayer, Listening, and Discernment**. The theme **"Pilgrims of Hope"** resonates strongly with our collective discernment, as we continue listening to the Spirit, fostering hope for the future of our diocese, and renewing our commitment to mission.

Key Events for the Jubilee Year:

- Local Pilgrimage to Gougane Barra: A diocesan pilgrimage to Gougane Barra will be organised as a local expression of our journey as Pilgrims of Hope. More details will follow early in the year.
- Jubilee of Young People (July-August 2025, Rome): I encourage parishes to support and accompany young people who may wish to take part in this international celebration of faith and hope with Pope Francis.
- Parish and Family Pilgrimages: Parishes are encouraged to explore local opportunities for pilgrimage and prayerful gatherings, fostering unity and renewal.

The Gift of Plenary Indulgence:

The Jubilee Year also brings the grace of a **plenary indulgence** for the faithful. In his Apostolic Bull *Spes Non Confundit*, Pope Francis outlined the conditions for receiving this grace:

- 1. Sacramental Confession (a state of grace, within a reasonable timeframe).
- 2. Reception of the Holy Eucharist.
- 3. Prayer for the Intentions of the Holy Father (e.g., the Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be).
- 4. Performing a **work of pilgrimage** or charity, such as visiting a designated holy site, participating in liturgical celebrations, or serving those in need.

These conditions invite us to renew our hearts and minds through God's mercy, making the Jubilee a profound opportunity for spiritual growth and reconciliation.

Looking Ahead Together:

The Jubilee Year is a gift and a call for all of us—clergy, religious, and laity—to journey in hope. I encourage each parish to begin considering how this theme of hope can be woven into liturgies, pilgrimages, catechesis, and pastoral initiatives throughout 2025.

Let us pray that this Jubilee will strengthen our faith, renew our communities, and inspire us to be true Pilgrims of Hope, bringing the light of Christ into the world.
