***Relics of St Carlo visit North Cathedral ahead of the Cork
 Eucharistic Procession***

The visit of the relics forms part of preparations for the 100th Anniversary of the Cork Eucharistic Procession. People have been making their way to the North Cathedral to venerate the relics of the first millennial saint. In his homily, Bishop Fintan spoke that from an early age, St Carlo developed a personal friendship with Jesus. "This visit of St Carlo's relics is part of our preparation for the 100th anniversary of the Eucharistic Procession in Cork. This historic procession is a once-in-a-lifetime moment for our diocese. It is a moment to remember the faith of those who went before us, but just as importantly to renew that faith in our own time".

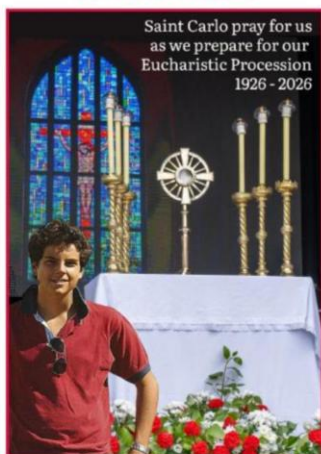

Celebrating 100 years of the Eucharistic Procession in Cork

**Cork Eucharistic Procession
on Sunday 7 June.**

This year, the Diocese of Cork and Ross invites you to take part in a truly historic moment:

The 100th anniversary of the Eucharistic Procession in Cork on Sunday 7th June

First held in 1926, the Eucharistic Procession was a wish amongst the people for unity, peace and reconciliation after the Civil War and the War of Independence. They asked Bishop Colahan to have a Eucharistic Procession, bringing Jesus in the Eucharist to the streets of our city. This is an opportunity to witness to our faith while being a part of a living tradition and the history of our city.

One hundred years on, we gather as a diocesan family to unite in prayer and thanksgiving, and to honour Jesus in the Eucharist. **Gathering at 2:30pm at the Cathedral of St Mary and St Anne, the Procession will begin at 3pm and finish with benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at the Grand Parade.**

Mass with Anointing of the Sick as we prepare for the 100th anniversary of the Eucharistic Procession

The Cathedral was overflowing on Monday afternoon as Mass with anointing of the Sick took place. This was the final day of the visit of the relics of St Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint, to the diocese. Members of the Cork and Ross Lourdes pilgrimage animated the Mass through choir, servers and readers. John Doolin, who sketched a picture of St Carlo Acutis presented Bishop Fintan and Msgr Anthony with a copy of his drawing.

Over 1,000 Primary School Students Venerate Relics of St Carlo Acutis

Primary schools from across the diocese were invited to bring their students to the Cathedral of St Mary and St Anne, Our Lady Crowned in Mayfield, and Christ Our Light in Ballincollig to venerate the relics of St Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint.

Monsignor Anthony Figueiredo, custodian of St Carlo's relics, spoke to the students about the young saint's life. He explained how Carlo enjoyed soccer and video games while also having a deep love for Jesus and the Eucharist. St Carlo described daily Mass and Eucharistic adoration as his "highway to heaven" and encouraged others to discover that active participation in the faith brings true fulfilment and happiness. Monsignor Anthony suggested that this is why St Carlo is such a good role model and witness to help us prepare for our own 100th Anniversary of the Eucharistic Procession.

Each student had the opportunity to receive a moment of personal prayer before the relic and received a prayer card with Pope Leo's blessing and a wristband memento.
